




**AVERAGE LENGTH






<b>Referrals Received by Response Type</b>	BI <sup>1</sup> report	Number of referrals received (Immediate Response, 10-day Response, Evaluated Out and N/A - Secondary)
<b>Children in Investigated Referrals</b>	BI report	Number of children in investigated referrals (IR and 10 Day only)
<b>New Cases Open</b>	BI report	Cases that started in the fiscal year. Cases open 1+ days anytime during the calendar year; includes voluntary and non-voluntary cases
<b>Entries to Care</b>	BI report	Entries of all days in care including all entries (not just first entries) and placements in cases and referrals
<b>Children Removed by Removal Agency</b>	BI report	Percentage of children removed by agency (CPS or Law Enforcement) or Safe Surrender
<b>Warrants Filed on Behalf of Children</b>	Court Services – Centralized Transcription	Number of warrants filed on behalf of children as provided by the Court Services – Centralized Transcription program responsible for processing warrant documents Note: Not all filed warrants result in a Court order for removal

<b>Average Length of Time in Care</b>	SafeMeasures <sup>2</sup>	Children in care for specified time lengths: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 0-1 year</li> <li>• 1-3 years</li> <li>• 3+ years</li> </ul> This includes placements in cases and referrals and only placements of 8 and more days in care
<b>Exits from Foster Care to Permanency*</b>	UC Berkeley CCWIP <sup>3</sup> – Entry Cohorts Over Time report	Average of entry cohorts of which 3 years have elapsed to show exit status at 12, 24 and 24+ months. Selected time periods: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Jul 2015–Jun 2016</li> <li>• Oct 2015–Sep 2016</li> <li>• Jan 2016–Dec 2016</li> <li>• Apr 2016–Mar 2017</li> </ul> Counts 8 and more days in care only; includes exits by reunification, adoption and guardianship

<b>Exits from Foster Care</b>	BI report	All exits by reunification, adoption or guardianship
<b>Re-entries into Foster Care*</b>	UC Berkeley CCWIP – P4 report	Selected time period: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Jul 2016-Jun 2017–Apr 2017-Mar 2018</li> </ul> (this is the original entry timeframe); counting 8 and more days in care upon first entry and counting all days in care upon re-entry
<b>Extended Foster Care (EFC) Open Cases</b>	BI report	Number of open cases assigned to the EFC units at any time during each month; this aligns with current EFC case tracking methodology

All data reflects ages 0-17, other than EFC open cases which are typically ages 18-21

\*Most data reflects a monthly average; however, some data matches the UCB CCWIP methodology for reporting outcomes and is therefore based on averages of different time periods, as noted on this Guide
