B&B Differential Response data- Of note, in 2016 services were offered only to families with children ages 0-5. There is more work to be done to increase referrals from CPS for B&B aftercare services. CPS would like to know if other agencies are collecting referral and outcome data? Feedback from workers is that families just want CPS out of their lives. To help the family transition from CPS to B&B, it is important that families are linked with B&B 6 weeks before closure. Families can already be linked with the Family Resource Centers well before closure to learn about the array of services available at the sites. For families who have already completed parenting classes, the home visiting program is described as a service to continue implementing the skills learned from
