<p>Welcome and Introductions (Stephanie Biegler)</p>	<p>Group members shared why they are on the committee.</p>
<p>Review and Approve Meeting Minutes (Verronda Moore & All)</p>	<p>Minutes were approved with the following revisions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Spell out all acronyms including ROI. ▪ Report back on Next Steps: B&B FY 15/16 impact evaluation. This will not be presented at this time, as the information in the report included families not referred by CPS.
<p>Review of S2 UC Berkeley Data & Group Discussion (Stephanie Linka)</p>	<p><u>Data</u> Refer to handouts. Though the percentage of recurrence of maltreatment has not decreased in 2018 quarter 3, the number of children with at least one subsequent allegation decreased by 748, a 17.2% decrease. Furthermore, the number of children with a subsequent substantiation decreased by 31 children, a 7% decrease from the baseline.</p> <p><u>Group Discussion Highlights</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ The families more challenging ▪ The needs for the family appears to be more complex. For example, housing, mental health services, and child care service needs appear to be more intense. ▪ Group proposes to assess if these families are involved with Court or Emergency Response level (i.e. how many referrals are closed situation stabilized with or without connections to services; service intervention levels for those families being promoted to an open case, etc.) ▪ The full impact of the Prevention and Permanency CFTs with regard to outcome measures will be better analyzed during Year 3 Progress Report given that full implementation started in January 2019.

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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ The group proposed to do a qualitative analysis on the 413 children who had another substantiated maltreatment allegation within 12 months of their initial report to determine if they were Emergency Response or Court involved cases and what other services, interventions, etc. were in place
Brief Overview of S2 Prevention Efforts and Data (Verronda Moore & Stephanie Biegler)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Refer to handout outlining Prevention Efforts. Cross system representatives from Sacramento County attended the Prevention Summit in San Diego, CA. The goal is to develop a prevention plan for Sacramento County. ▪ B&B Differential Response data- Of note, in 2016 services were offered only to families with children ages 0-5. There is more work to be done to increase referrals from CPS for B&B aftercare services. ▪ CPS would like to know if other agencies are collecting referral and outcome data? ▪ Feedback from workers is that families just want CPS out of their lives. To help the family transition from CPS to B&B, it is important that families are linked with B&B 6 weeks before closure. Families can already be linked with the Family Resource Centers well before closure to learn about the array of services available at the sites. For families who have already completed parenting classes, the home visiting program is described as a service to continue implementing the skills learned from the parenting classes now that the children are in the home. ▪ Services are important, but if the families don't have a connection or built a relationship, aftercare plans will not work. Do families know their B&B workers? ▪ Black Child Legacy Cultural Brokers did a meet and greet at all of the CPS offices to introduce their services and develop a relationship with the social worker. Since

Possible questions to further explore include the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ What was the families Aftercare plan ▪ Zip code location ▪ Was this Court or ER level families ▪ Did the first allegation and subsequent allegation include Domestic Violence, Substance Abuse and/or Mental Health ▪ Were the allegations the same or different ▪ Basic demographic data (age, ethnicity, etc.) for the children, the parent/guardian and perpetrator

Next Steps	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Build relationships with Community Based Organization (CBO) service Providers. 2. Conduct Meet and Greet sessions with CBO staff and CPS social workers learn about the providers' services directly from home visitors/front line staff. 3. Review timing of when CPS brings in Aftercare CBO service providers to help families build trust with the CBO staff. For example are social workers making referrals at least 6 weeks prior to CPS closure? 4. Bring the previous case review tool to review what items should be used for the proposed data dig.
